Communicating with Toddlers Through Nonverbal Signals (by Young Children)

Eye contact: Making frequent contact with a child communicates that the teacher is available, connected, interested, attentive, and engaged with the child and what he/she is doing.

Facial Expressions: Reading a child's facial expressions and mirroring the feelings expressed or responding with a smile indicates that the teacher recognizes and understands the child's feeling and her attempts to communicate those feelings to others.

Body Language: Children and teachers communicate with each other nonverbally through body language. Approval, disapproval, anger, acceptance, and many other feelings, attitudes and responses can be interpreted by the way people stand, sit, fold their arms, turn away, or carry out other bodily movements. Teachers who sit facing the children at their level show that they are accessible, and nodding their heads communicates approval and understanding.
